
Since its beginning the ICYCW has focused on many different themes to address the needs and development of young people in the world of work.

ACTIVITY REPORT 2012-2016

The ICYCW embarked on an ambitious plan which laid down the priorities for 2012-2016.

The plan was put into effect through the joint effortsof the national movements, commissions, and the international secretariat.

Despite various hurdles along the way, the coordination lived its mission around the world which is summarized as follows;

Administration

The premises of the headquarters of the ICYCW was provided by the Diocese of Rome.

All activities of the ICYCW were coordinated from these headquarters which also provided residence for the secretariat members.

The secretariat maintained its contacts and relations with the Diocese of Rome as well as with the Dicastery for Laity, Family and Life (formerly Pontifical Council for the Laity) under which the ICYCW is recognized.

Coordination of the ICYCW

From 2012-2016, the ICYCW carried out a rigorous execution of different programs of training and exchanges at national, continental and international levels. The trainings covered different themes generated from the situations and realities of the young workers.

Chaplaincy development was emphasized as an important component in the formation programs and leadership development of the young leaders. Chaplaincy training for both clergy and lay adults was incorporated in the formation programs for the young people. Visits were also done to seminaries in Rome to introduce the movement to the priests, seminarians, and brothers with the aim of forming them for possible future roles as chaplains when they go back to their countries.

The ICYCW through its leaders, carried out representation work, bringing the voice of the young workers to different platforms in the national, continental and international levels.

The work was done mainly with Vatican, Bishops' conferences, International Labor Organization, Catholic inspired organizations, Catholic Action Movements, and other governmental, non-governmental, faith based, and civil society organizations and institutions. This aided in creating awareness about the life, work and hopes of the young people to the different platforms of discussions as well as create and reinforce networks for collaboration with the ICYCW.

Finance remained a challenge in realizing the planned actions but the national movements, commissions and secretariat worked together to identify means of fund raising and ways of ensuring financial sustainability.

The secretariat engaged the services of a financial consultant to provide expertise in areas of financial management and planning.

The national movements and collaborators in the coordination worked jointly to support the establishment of the YCW movement in countries where it not exist

The fruits of which were realized in the participation of the new movements during the 9th International Congress of 2016.

The ICYCW used different means of communication to reach out to its members, partner organizations and the general public at large.

Through the secretariat, means were identified to facilitate efficient and timely flow of information.

Organization of the coordination

The ICYCW facilitated the implementation of its plans through the different components of its structure. An elaborate strategic plan was developed in 2014 and it guided the functioning of the different components of ICYCW.

The structure was composed of the following components; the national movements, international council, international secretariat, international commissions, regional commissions, strategy development component, and collaborators.

It has been a great discovery for me because I really wanted to understand the reality of young people worldwide, not by reading the newspaper but by listening to real testimonies of life.


I was very glad to be able to meet and work with different leaders in different parts of the world. This, surely, is the way to build a better future for young workers.

The 9th International Congress of ICYCW was held in Seoul, South Korea from 19th Aug-1st of September. There were around 90 participants from 29 countries including delegates from each countries, chaplains, International Secretariat members, Commission members and Korean Volunteers.

It was delivered the YCW methodology training, theme seminar, exchange programme with other organization, Korean culture experience, inspection of ICYCW structure and election of new International Secretariat members.

During these two weeks we were able to know the situation of the YCW in each country; share the reality of work and especially the difficulty of access to work for young people around the world; and to reaffirm ourselves in our shared task as a movement of evangelization of the world of work.

Under the theme "Work is the way, Giving young people Hope and Responsibility for their future" we carry out a Review of Life, the own method of the YCW characterized by the stages of SEE, JUDGE and ACT.

When SEE reality, we contemplate the stories of many young people who suffer the consequences of the unfair world of work in which we live, which causes precarious working conditions in all countries of the world, and which especially attacks young people.

In the stage of the JUDGMENT, in the light of the Gospel, of the Social Doctrine of the Church, of the Laudato Si', etc., we reaffirm ourselves in thinking that the person has dignity as a children of God, and that therefore he must be in the center of society, of the economy and of politics.

We believe that a more just, supportive and fraternal world is possible, from love, equity, respect for what is different and respect for creation.

Starting from the reality that we observe, the YCW reaffirms us in our mission to ACT as a movement, from our young, worker and Christian vocation.

YOUNG

Knowing what is the reality we live, we want to raise our voice because no one knows what we live. The world is constantly changing, and young people must be protagonists, we have to make our voices heard and fight for our dreams.

CHRISTIANS

We are convinced the dignity of the person as a childeren of God. We believe that it is an opportunity to transmit this conviction to other people: each young person has dignity and this must be respected.
